# Changing Lives with Donated Medicines

Every year, millions of Americans are unable to access critically needed medicines—not because the medicine isn't available, but because they can't afford it. At the same time, billions of safe, unused medications that could be repurposed are thrown away.

SafeNetRx offers the solution: surplus medications from pharmacies, clinics, prisons and long-term care facilities are collected, and every unit is inspected for safety and redistribution. Individuals who have fallen through the cracks of our health care system—unable to afford their prescription medications—receive assistance at no cost. SafeNetRx is the safety net that catches them and gives them freedom to thrive.



## **OUR MISSION**

To solve medication inequity through the responsible collection and distribution of donated medicine, ensuring no one is denied care simply because they can't afford it.

### **OUR VISION**

Our vision is to be the national leader in the collection, inspection and distribution of donated medicines through:

- Establishment of a national drug donation system based on the success of Iowa's Drug Donation Repository model.
- Demonstration of exemplary stewardship in the collection, inspection, distribution and disposal of donated medicines.
- Collaboration with industry leaders, academia, legislative bodies and regulatory stakeholders to establish national standards for donated medicines.
- Support of clinics, pharmacies and other health care stakeholders in the delivery of safe, efficient and effective pharmacy services for underserved populations.
- Provision of training, research and evaluation opportunities to support ongoing innovation in charitable pharmacy services.

# SafeNetRx launches historic partnership with Nebraska

SafeNetRx Drug Donation began as a bold solution to a nationwide crisis: medication insecurity. Launched in 2007 as the nation's first statewide drug donation repository, our model was built on a simple belief—no one should be forced to choose between health and hardship. Today, that idea has become a national blueprint.

In fiscal year 2025, we reached several major milestones:

- Served 160,861 patients in need of life-saving medication.
- Processed more than \$155 million in donated medicines since our founding.
- Prevented more than 17.3 million doses from being discarded—helping patients while reducing environmental waste.

These numbers are not just statistics. They represent real people—neighbors, cancer patients and caregivers— who turned to SafeNetRx when every other option was gone. Each dose dispensed tells a story of hope and resilience.

But this year was about more than numbers.
It was about momentum.

In 2025, we officially expanded into Nebraska, thanks to historic bipartisan legislation and a shared vision for equitable health care access. This is the nation's first multi-state drug donation repository where health departments in multiple states have joined forces to combat medication insecurity. With services to go live in Nebraska and growing interest

from other states, SafeNetRx is poised to help build a truly national drug donation network —rooted in safety, sustainability and compassion.

This expansion doesn't change our core mission. It strengthens it. We remain deeply committed to our values: integrity in product safety, dignity for the patients we serve and excellence in how we collect, inspect and distribute donated medicines.

Looking ahead, our goals are ambitious—because they must be. Millions across the U.S. need life-saving medications, and we have a proven model. We're working to scale operations across multiple states, strengthen our partnerships with providers, legislators and donors and champion national standards for drug donation safety and impact.

Every year, more than 57 million Americans struggle to afford medications, while over \$5 billion worth of safe, unused medicine goes to waste. At SafeNetRx, we see this not as a challenge, but as an opportunity to build a compassionate model of care that heals both people and the planet.

# Reducing Health Care Costs

Charitable medication programs can reduce health system costs by 27% (\$3,161 annually per patient) and inpatient stays by 20%, according to the RTI International and Dispensary of Hope Research Report (2022).\*

- SafeNetRx health system cost savings in FY2025 were \$41M based on these estimates.
- On average, SafeNetRx patients save more than \$200 per 30-day prescription.

# Our Safety Protocol

# Setting the standard with the strictest protocols

When it comes to medicine, safety is non-negotiable. SafeNetRx has built one of the most trusted and rigorous safety protocols in the nation to ensure every donated medication meets the highest standards before reaching a patient.

Since launching the nation's first statewide drug donation repository in 2007, SafeNetRx has maintained a perfect safety record with **zero patient safety incidents**. Our protocols are built on decades of pharmacy best practices, legal compliance and a deep commitment to patient care.

# Our Safety Protocol Includes:

### **Strict Donation Criteria**

We only accept medications that meet strict criteria.

- Sealed in tamper-evident packaging
- Non-expired
- Non-controlled substances
- No signs of tampering or deterioration
- Do not require refrigeration

### **Expert Inspections**

Licensed pharmacists thoroughly inspect every unit of donated medicine for:

- Label accuracy and legibility
- Expiration dates and lot tracking
- Physical integrity and packaging condition
- Compliance with state and federal regulations

## **Secure Inventory Management**

Each medication is logged in our system and tracked from donation to dispensing, ensuring full chain-of-custody transparency and enabling providers to order only what's safe and needed.

## Regulated Handling & Disposal

Medications that do not meet safety standards are disposed of according to state and federal pharmaceutical waste regulations, protecting patients and the environment.

## **Built for Trust. Designed for Impact.**

Our inspection and fulfillment process is backed by pharmacy experts, supported by volunteers trained in best practices and regularly audited for compliance. We work hand-in-hand with state boards of pharmacy, public health agencies and health care providers to ensure that safety never takes a back seat to efficiency.

## Safe for Patients. Trusted by Providers.

Providers across Iowa and Nebraska choose SafeNetRx because they know our medications are held to the same standards as those in any retail pharmacy. Patients can trust that what they receive is not only free, it's safe, effective and handled with care.

At SafeNetRx, safety isn't just a policy—it's a promise.



# Donations Make a Difference

Our donor partners provide medications for a wide range of health needs, including:

- Heart disease, diabetes and high blood pressure
- Mental health conditions
- Cancer treatment
- Asthma and respiratory illness
- Infectious disease

# Reducing Cost, Restoring Dignity

Medication donors are not only improving health outcomes, they're also helping reduce the burden on the entire health care system. Donations decrease unnecessary emergency room visits, lower hospitalization rates and reduce pharmaceutical waste disposal costs (which can exceed \$25 per pound).

# **SafeVet**FY DONOR IMPACT

We surpassed **\$155M** (average wholesale price, or AWP) in total donated medicine since we opened our doors in 2007.

In FY25 alone, our donors contributed more than **\$28M** (AWP) worth of medications.

This year, SafeNetRx welcomed **13** new donors to our network.

# Repurposing unused meds to reduce hazardous waste and change lives

Every donated medication follows a carefully designed path—from the moment it's received to the moment it reaches a patient in need. Our process ensures safety, compliance, transparency and impact at every step.

1 Donate

Clinics, pharmacies and long-term care facilities from across the country donate unused, sealed and non-expired medications that would otherwise be discarded. Each donation helps reduce waste and expands access to lifesaving treatments.

(2) Receive & Record

Each shipment is received at our repository in Grimes, Iowa. Trained staff and volunteers catalog every unit of medication, entering essential information into our real-time inventory system.

(3) Inspect

Every medication goes through a rigorous inspection process by licensed pharmacists and certified technicians to ensure it meets the highest standards of safety and quality.

4 Fulfill & Ship

Once providers place an order based on their patients' needs, our team fulfills it from available inventory. Shipments are securely packaged and sent to licensed clinics, charitable pharmacies and Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) for dispensing.

**5) Dispense & Change Lives** 

Partner clinics dispense medications directly to eligible patients, often those who have exhausted all other options. For many, SafeNetRx is a last resort and a life-changing resource.



Clinics, pharmacies, and charitable health care providers serve on the front lines of medication access—ensuring donated medicines are dispensed with care, dignity and compassion.

# In FY25, the SafeNetRx provider network:

- Dispensed more than 1.3M doses of donated medicine valued at more than \$12M (AWP).
- Cared for 13,018 patients who could not afford needed prescriptions—bringing our all-time total to 160,861 patients served.

# SafeNetRx—now serving Nebraska

In 2025, SafeNetRx reached a defining milestone with its expansion into Nebraska. Following a unanimous legislative vote, Governor Jim Pillen signed legislation establishing a statewide drug donation repository in partnership with SafeNetRx — a powerful step toward ensuring that no medication goes to waste and no patient goes without the care they need. Nebraska patients will begin receiving donated medicines in FY2026, marking the start of a new chapter in our mission to end medication insecurity and affirming the strength and scalability of the SafeNetRx model.
